



# GB to NI Vehicle Movement Flowchart- Windsor Framework May 2025

## Background

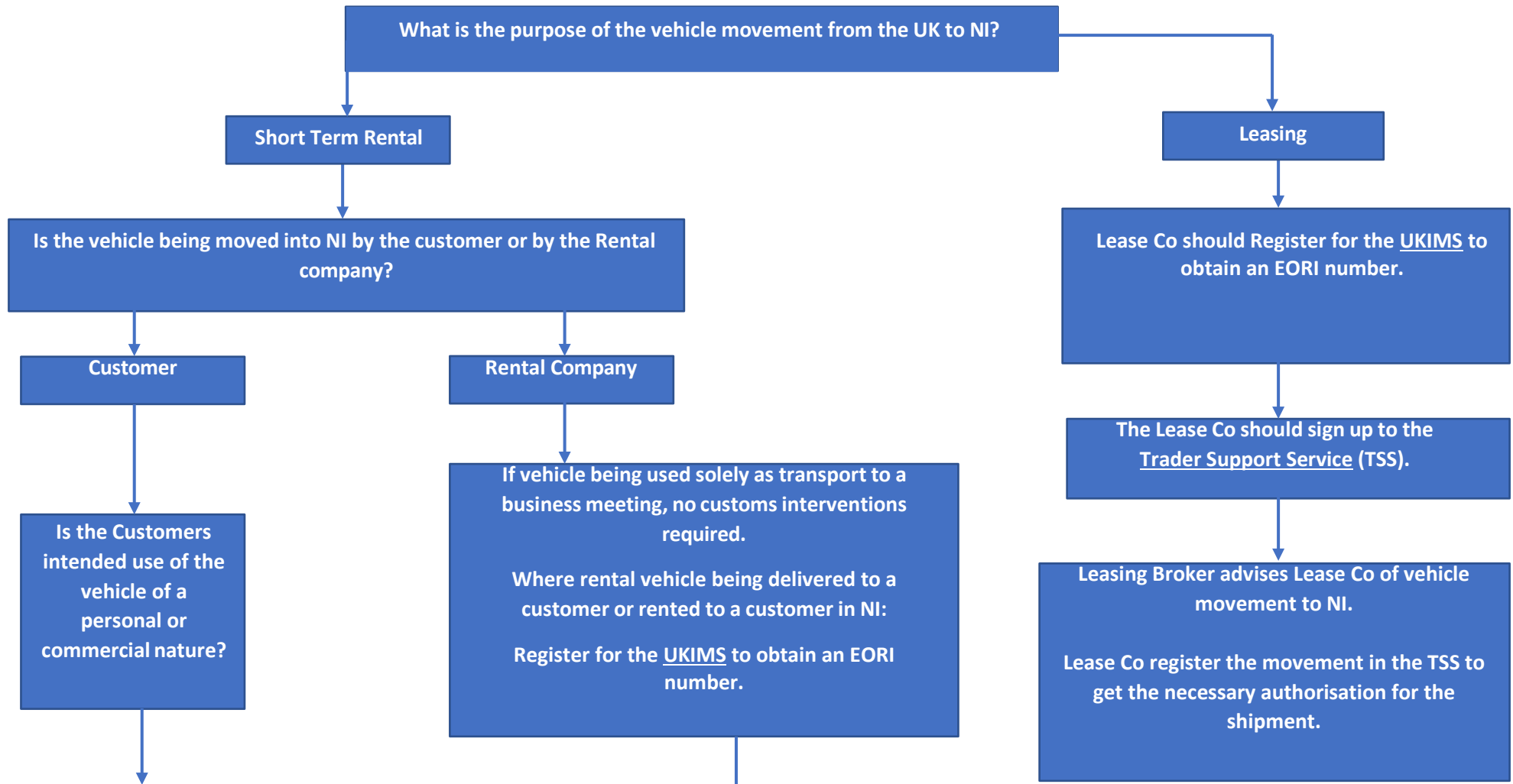
From the 1<sup>st</sup> May 2025, if goods are transported into Northern Ireland (NI) from Great Britain (GB) the 'Simplified Processes for Internal Market Movements' under the Windsor Framework guidelines will apply where goods are considered 'not at risk' of moving into the EU.

BVRLA members will need to register for the UK Internal Market Scheme ([UKIMS](#)) should they wish to use simplified declarations for vehicle movement from this date. This flowchart is intended to support BVRLA Members with the process for moving vehicles on a rental or lease agreement from GB to a customer in NI.

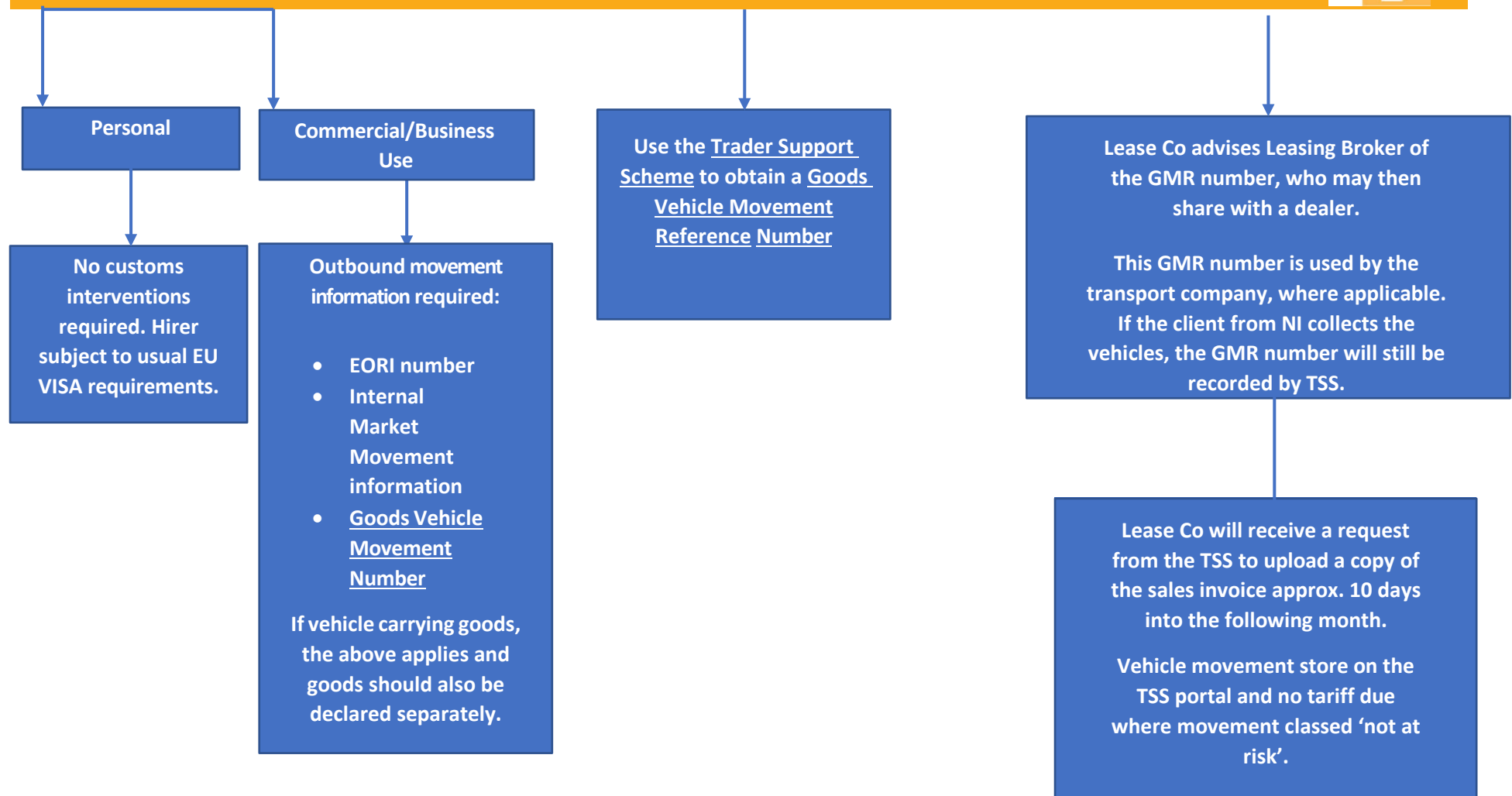
